


Breast Cancer Screening

By the Numbers

Every year, breast cancer takes a toll on families and communities all across the United States.

Screening mammograms, free of cost, are widely accessible. But follow-up diagnostic tests and supplemental imaging often come with steep out-of-pocket costs, posing a barrier for patients.



1 in 8 women

in the U.S. will be diagnosed with invasive breast cancer.



Almost **40%** of patients would skip recommended follow-up diagnostic imaging if they had to pay a deductible.




Out-of-pocket costs for diagnostic breast imaging can range from

\$100 to over \$3,000.



31 states

have ended patient cost sharing for diagnostic breast imaging, with little impact on premiums.



Over 375,000 women

may skip mammograms due to fears of new out-of-pocket costs.



43,000

women and men in the U.S. will lose their lives to breast cancer in 2025.

The Access to Breast Cancer Diagnosis Act

would eliminate patients' out-of-pocket cost for needed diagnostic and supplemental breast imaging.
